


# LED Interactive Multi-Touch Display User Manual



Please properly keep the manual for further reference. This is the general user manual for all interactive panels. Therefore, it may be different from the actual product.

#### Welcome:

Thanks for purchasing this product. Please read the instructions carefully before using this product.

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# **Safety Instruction**

- Where the mains plug or an appliance coupler is used as the disconnect device the disconnect device shall remain readily operable.

In the preceding scenarios, do not continue to use the product, disconnect power supply immediately and contact professional staff for troubleshooting.



### Do not drop liquid, metal or combustible into the product.

- If any liquid or metal is dropped into the product, power off the product and disconnect power supply, then contact professional staff for solutions.
- Pay attention to the children when they are close to the product.

## Do not damage the power cable.

- Do not damage, change, wind, bend, heat or drag the power cable forcibly.

# Before you move the product, disconnect all the external connections and separate all the toppling preventing devices.

Move the product carefully to prevent it from being hit or squeezed, especially the screen, which may cause injury if broken.

## Clean the dust and metal on the power plug regularly.

- When you are cleaning, fire or electric shock may be caused if the product is powered on.
- Keep in mind to pull out the power plug before cleaning it by using a dried cloth.



### Do not put items on the top of the product.

- Do not put items, such as a container for liquid (a vase, flowerpot, cosmetics or liquid medicine), on the top of the product.

# 1 Mounting Requirements

# 1.1 Bearing

You can choose the potable or wall mounting method according to your needs. Wall mounting can substantially save the space.

If you choose portable mounting, use the mounting rack or support. If you want to use a self-made mounting rack, the bearing capacity of the rack should be at last four times of the actual weight of the display. The bearing capacity of the mounting support must be at least four times of the actual weight of the display to ensure steadiness of the interactive panel.

When you choose wall mounting, the bearing capacity of the mounting surface must be at least four times of the weight of the display. When the mounting surface is a wall or ceiling of a building, the wall must be built with solid bricks, concrete or materials of equal intensity. If you need to mount the display on a loose surface such as an old brick wall, wood plank wall, solid brick wall, metal or non-metal structure wall, or a wall with a thick decoration layer, take necessary consolidating measures to ensure that the display is steadily mounted.




# 3 Basic Operation

# 3.1 Power on


**Step 1** Power the interactive panel with 100V-240V 50Hz/60Hz AC power supply.



**Step 2** Turn on the rocker switch at the bottom of the interactive panel (next to the power port) to enable power supply. In this case, the indicator is in red.




Step 3 Press power switch on the interactive panel or on the remote controller to turn on the interactive panel. In this case, the indicator is in green. Press **PC Power** on the front panel to power on the OPS (for all-in-one models only).



# 3.2 Power off

• Standby status: When the interactive panel is in running status, press **Power** or on the remote controller. The interactive panel enters in standby status. When the OPS is in running status, Press **PC Power** on the front panel. The OPS enters in standby status (for all-in-one models only).



- Power off: Turn off the rocker switch at the bottom of the interactive panel (next to the power port) or pull out the power plug to switch off the interactive panel completely.
- For all-in-one models, turn off the OPS before powering off the interactive panel.



If the **PowerKey Turn On PC** is enabled, you do not need to press **PC power** to control the OPS during the power-on and power-off processes.

Status of the power indicator is as follows:

# 3.3 Software Installation

• Recommended configuration

- CPU: Inter (R) Core i3 2.27GHz or AMD CPU with equivalent performance

Memory: 1GBHard drive: 1GB

- Graphics card: supports DirectX 9 or above
- If the interactive panel is equipped with the latest version of handwriting software in the PC before being delivered, please skip the step.
- HID drive-free function only applies for Vista, Windows 7or higher version (realize the functions of multi-touch etc.). The touch LCD display with Windows XP version should install/run the software for normal use.
- **Step 1** Insert the official USB cable into the USB ports of the computer and touch LCD display.
- **Step 2** Insert the official software installation disk into the computer.
- Step 3 Double click the Application.exe, follow the instructions and complete the installation of the touch LCD display software.
- **Step 4** The computer needs to restart so as to activate the software after installation completed. Save all the files in the computer and restart.


# 3.4 Software Uninstall

# 3.5 Software Calibration

To work normally, the handwriting of the projected image on the touch LCD display should coincide with the actual one so as to calibrate accurately. The following situations need calibration.






## **Tips**


- To ensure the handwriting accuracy, use the pen provided together with the interactive panel rather a finger to perform calibration.
- Calibration errors may cause failures in touch functions of the interactive panel. In that case, please perform calibration again.
- Tap ESC on the keyboard during the calibration process to cease calibration.
- The calibration interface varies between different software versions. Please follow instructions provided on the actual interface.

# 3.7 OPS Installation

Insert the OPS into the slot and fasten it with two M4 screws respectively on the top and bottom. Both the standard OPS and non-standard OPS are supported.

The OPS does not support hot-plugging. Please insert or pull out the OPS after the interactive panel is disconnected from the power supply.

# 3.8 Select Signal Channel

Press **Source** to display the list of signal sources. Press  $\triangle/\nabla$  to select an option and press **OK** to enter the sub-menu.

If no signal source is available, press **MENU**. In the displayed list, set **Signal Search** to **On**. After 30 seconds, the interactive panel automatically detects signal sources and

switches to a signal source. The signal source searching scope and priority sequence is: PC, HDMI1, HDMI2, HDMI3, OPC-PC, Component, AV.

# ■ NOTE

- The panel has signal source memory. Therefore, the panel automatically selects the signal source of last use after it is switched on.
- Only when the OPS is inserted, **OPS-PC** is displayed in the **Input Source** list.



# 4 Menu

Press **MENU** on the remote controller to display the menu (**TIME-> PICTURE-> SOUND-> OPTION**). Press  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  to choose a sub-menu and press **OK** to enter the sub-menu. Press **EXIT** to quit the menu.


# **4.1** Time

Enter the TIME menu to display items including Clock, Off Time, On Time, Sleep Timer, Auto Sleep and OSD Duration. Press △/▼ to select an item and press OK to enter the sub-menu.



## Clock


After you enter the **Clock** sub-menu, the interface shows items including the day, month, year, hour and minute.



- $\triangleright$  Press  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  to select an item.
- Press ◀/▶ to adjust the value of the selected item.
- Press MENU to return to the parent menu.
- Press **EXIT** to quit the menu.

## **Off Time**


After you enter the **Off Time** sub-menu, the interface will show items including hour and minute. Press ◀/▶ to change the off time mode: **Once**, **Everyday**, **Mon - Fri**, **Mon - Sat**, **Sat - Sun**, **Sunday** and **Off**.



- Press ▲/▼ to select an item.
- Press **◄/▶** to adjust the value of the selected item.
- Press **MENU** to return to the parent menu.
- Press **EXIT** to quit the menu.

## On Time


After you enter the **On Time** sub-menu, the interface will show items including hour, minute, signal source, and volume. Press ◀/▶ to change the on time mode: **Once**, **Everyday**, **Mon - Fri**, **Mon - Sat**, **Sat - Sun**, **Sunday** and **Off**.



- Press ▲/▼ to select an item.
- Press ◀/▶ to adjust the value of the selected item.
- Press MENU to return to the parent menu.
- Press **EXIT** to quit the menu.

# **Sleep Timer**

After you enter the **Sleep Timer** sub-menu, the interface shows **Off**, **10 min**, **20 min**, **30 min**, **60 min**, **90 min**, **120 min**, **180 min**, and **240 min**.



- Press ▲/▼ to select an item.
- Press MENU to return to the parent menu.
- Press **EXIT** to quit the menu.

## **Auto Sleep**

After you enter the Auto Sleep sub-menu, the interface shows On and Off options.



- Press ▲/▼ to select an item.
- > Press **MENU** to return to the parent menu.
- > Press **EXIT** to quit the menu.

## **OSD Duration**

After you enter the **OSD Duration** sub-menu, the interface shows options including **Off**, **5 Sec**, **10 Sec** and **15 Sec**.



- Press ▲/▼ to select an item.
- Press MENU to return to the parent menu.

# 4.2 Picture

After you enter the **PICTURE** menu, the interface shows options including **Picture Mode**, **Color Temperature**, **Aspect Ratio**, **Noise Reduction**, **Screen**, and **Backlight**. Press ▲/▼ to select an item and **OK** to enter the sub-menu.



## **Picture Mode**

After you enter the **Picture Mode** sub-menu, the interface shows options including **Contrast**, **Brightness**, **Color**, **Sharpness**, and **Tint**. Press ◀/▶ to choose **Standard** − **Mild** − **User** − **Dynamic** image.





#### Note:

The Tint option is only effective when the signal system is NTSC.

## **Color Temperature**

When you enter the **Color Temperature** sub-menu, the interface shows options including **Red**, **Green** and **Blue**. Press **◄/▶** to choose **Medium**, **Warm**, **User** or **Cold**.



- Press  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  to select an item.
- Press  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  to adjust the value of the selected item.
- > Press **MENU** to return to the parent menu.
- Press EXIT to quit the menu.

## **Aspect Ratio**

After you enter the **Aspect Ratio** sub-menu, the interface shows options including **Auto**, **4:3**, **16:9**, **Zoom 1**, **Zoom 2**, **Just Scan**, and **Panorama**.



- Press ▲/▼ to select an item.
- > Press **MENU** to return to the parent menu.
- Press EXIT to quit the menu.

Note

Adjustable options may vary under different signal sources.

### **Noise Reduction**

After you enter the **Noise Reduction** sub-menu, the interface shows options including **Off**, **Low**, **Middle**, **High**, and **Default**.



## Screen

After you enter the **Screen** sub-menu, the interface shows options including **Auto Adjust**, **Horizontal Position**, **Vertical Position**, **Size** and **Phase**. When **Auto Adjust** is selected, press **OK** to automatically adjust the window. The brighter the surrounding is, the more accurate the automatic adjustment will be.



- Press ▲/▼ to select an item.
- ➤ Press 
  /► to adjust the value of the selected item.
- Press **MENU** to return to the parent menu.
- Press **EXIT** to quit the menu.

## M NOTE

The option is only effective when the signal source is PC.

## **Backlight**

When the ECO mode is set to **Standard**, press **◄/▶** to adjust the value. Press **MENU** to return to the parent menu. Press **EXIT** to quit the menu.

#### Note:

In the ECO and Auto mode, the Backlight option is in grey and cannot be adjusted.


# **4.3 Sound**

After you enter the **SOUND** menu, the interface shows options including **Sound Mode**, **Balance**, **Auto Volume**, **Surround Sound**, **SPDIF MODE**, **EQ**, and **Listen Without Display**. Press **△**/**▼** to select an option and **OK** to enter the sub-menu.



## **Sound Mode**

After you enter the **Sound Mode** sub-menu, the interface shows options including **Treble** and **Bass**. Press **◄**/**▶** to set the **Sound Mode** to **Standard**, **Music**, **Movie**, **Sports** and **User**. When the sound mode is set to **User**:

- Press MENU to return to the parent menu.
- Press **EXIT** to quit the menu.

## **Balance**

After you enter the **Balance** sub-menu, press **◄/▶** to adjust the value. Press **MENU** to return to the parent menu. Press **EXIT** to quit the menu.

### Auto Volume


After you enter the Auto Volume sub-menu, the interface shows On and Off options.



- Press ▲/▼ to select an item.
- Press MENU to return to the parent menu.
- Press **EXIT** to quit the menu.

## **Surround Sound**

After you enter the **Surround Sound** sub-menu, the interface shows options including **Off**, **Surround**, and **SRS TruSurround XT**.



- Press ▲/▼ to select an item.
- Press MENU to return to the parent menu.
- Press EXIT to quit the menu.

## **SPDIF Mode**


After you enter the **SPDIF MODE** sub-menu, the interface shows options including **PCM** and **Auto**.



- Press ▲/▼ to select an item.
- Press MENU to return to the parent menu.
- Press EXIT to quit the menu.

## **EQ**

After you enter the EQ sub-menu, the interface shows options including 120Hz, 500Hz, 1.2KHz, 7.5KHz and 12KHz. When the EQ mode is set to User:



- Press ▲/▼ to select an item.
- Press ◀/▶ to adjust the value of the selected item.
- Press MENU to return to the parent menu.
- Press **EXIT** to quit the menu.

# **Listen Without Display**

Press  $\triangle/\nabla$  to switch to **Listen Without Display (Off)** option. Press **OK** and the screen turns black. Press any button on the remote controller under the **Listen Without Display** mode to restore to the normal mode.

#### 4.4 Option

Before you contact the technical support staff, please identify a fault according to the following table. If the fault cannot be restored based on the solutions, contact the local distributor for help. For your safety, please do not repair the product by your own.

#### The following symptoms are not faults:

- A very few of constantly bright or dark pixels, such as tiny red, blue, green or dark points, may exist on the LCD. This symptom is not a fault and does not affect running functions of the panel.
- Slight sound may occur due to the backlight adjustment or ventilation. This is a normal symptom.
- The image and sound are normal. However, you can sense static electricity when you touch the LCD and metal back cover. This is a normal symptom.



# 11 Maintenance Tips


- Do not put or install the product near a heat source or under direct sunlight, or in dusty or humid places, or somewhere the product may be hit or damaged by mechanical vibration. To maximize the performance, it needs to be put away from equipment such as grid, large metal objects and radar stations as far as possible.
- Do not wipe the panel with any chemical reagent. Solvents may damage the
  enclosure or paint. If the panel is stained by dust, cut off the power and then clean the
  panel using a dried cloth with a little of warm water. Use a clean soft cloth to clean
  the LCD of the panel.
- Do not frequently switch on and off the product, which may shorten the product service life. After the panel is switched off, wait for three minutes before switching it on again. If the product is not to be used for a long period of time, please power off the product and pull out the power plug.
- Do not maximize the brightness and contrast of the LCD for a long period of time, which may shorten the LCD service life.
- Do not use a hard object to write on the touch screen, which may scratch the LCD.



# 12 Clean the Infrared Tube

The interactive panel uses the horizontal and vertical infrared matrix to detect and locate the user's touch. The screen is surrounded by an infrared tube (including the infrared acceptor and emitter), which forms an infrared net covering on the screen surface. When a user touches the screen, fingers or other opaque objects block the infrared rays that cross the touch point, which helps the controller detect the coordinate position of the touch point.

Dust is easily retained on the screen surface due to its long-term exposure in the air and causes ineffective touch or inaccurate positioning. Therefore, you need to clean the infrared tube around the screen regularly.
